

Men's Division I At Large Projections

The following analysis is based on. RPI, SOS and Quality Wins/Losses.

Here is what we know:

- (1) Criteria: <https://laxmath.com/men/xm01.php>
- (2) Eight At Large Selections
- (3) The Selection Committee adheres to the primary criteria of RPI, SOS and QWF

The following teams are 'locks':

- Maryland: RPI/SOS/QWF = 2/1/1
- Princeton: RPI/SOS/QWF = 1/3/3
- Penn State: RPI/SOS/QWF = 4/6/5
- Cornell: RPI/SOS/QWF = 3/16/2

The following teams are on the bubble:

- Duke: RPI/SOS/QWF = 7/7/9
- Notre Dame: RPI/SOS/QWF = 5/13/6
- Syracuse: RPI/SOS/QWF = 8/9/11
- North Carolina: RPI/SOS/QWF = 6/15/8
- Ohio State: RPI/SOS/QWF = 9/18/4
- Michigan: RPI/SOS/QWF = 13/4/15
- Harvard: RPO/SOS/QWD = 10/14/10
- Richmond: RPI/SOS/QWF = 12/11/12
- Army: RPI/SOS/QWF = 11/27/7
- Virginia: RPI/SOS/QWF = 14/10/27

Analysis

If either Cornell or Princeton win the Ivy tournament and Maryland or Penn State with the Big 10 tournament, then there are six remaining invitations for the remaining 10 teams. If Army wins the Patriot League tournament, then there are 9 teams remaining for those 6 invitations.

If Yale wins the Ivy and Johns Hopkins/Rutgers/Michigan wins the B10, then there are 4 invitations remaining for 8 teams.

If Virginia defeats Duke in the final regular season game for each, Duke will not make the ACC tournament and is highly questionable to make the championship tournament. Virginia probably needs to win the ACC tournament to gain an invitation.

Army defeated North Carolina so if Army fails to win the Patriot, they possibly would jump North Carolina.
